

Introducing our Cuya Wisdom Circle, the Tribe of Sacred Stones

The inner circle has our wairuru seed from Peru, called simply 'Seed' which serves as our core Rainbow Seed and points to JoyTech's Home page.

The second circle has 3 stones. From top to bottom, we note Crowning, Dark and Swirls ... where Crowning conducts you to NLP Services; Dark to What is NLP?; and Swirls leads to NLP Explorations.

The third circle has 4 stones. From top to bottom, you can see Punco, Facets, Earth, and Lightning ... where Punco reveals the Ceremony Design pages; Facets shows *VISIBLE WOMEN*; Earth is Strategies for Spiritual Mastery; and Lightning displays Wisdom from the Q'ero.

The outer Circle has 5 stones. From top to bottom, you can click on Circles, Sands, Veins, Shadows and Waters ... where Circles stands as the link to Events and Options; Sands directs you to Musings; Veins steers toward Mahalo; Shadows to Links; and Waters opens to the Contact Us page.



The sacred cuyas speak out ...

Mahalo for this altar as laid out during Ohana celebrations and ceremonies at Buescher State Park in central Texas.

Since the cuyas are showing up in all sorts of mysterious ways, ready, willing and able to participate, below is our proper acknowledgement for these sacred ones.

Seed or Rainbow Seed – This is a small wairuru seed from South America, and there is actually a collection of these seeds shown on the mesas or weavings above. Some of the rainbow seeds are at the center of the upper mesa, in the far left corner; others are on the small red silk pouch along with sister seeds, the small, black lava stones which also serve as rainbow seeds.



Crowning – This cuya traveled from the high Andes, coursing along streams and rivers until it was deposited on the Isle of Painted Stones, a powerful energetic vortex where three rivers converge into the Madre de Dios, part of the headwaters of the Amazon. Crowning is at the top center of the upper mesa.

Dark – A small, smoothed black lava stone tumbled from the slopes of Haleakala all the way down to the black sand beach. Dark joined this journey, with permission, from near the Birth Canal on Pailoa Bay in Wai'anapanapa State Park. Dark is near the bottom left of the lower mesa.



Swirls – A blue stone, of mysterious origin and composition, has a distinctive swirling pattern and coloring in shades of blue and turquoise, which lend it a unique energy. Swirls is at the top right of the lower mesa.

Punco – a smaller turquoise chunk called by a Quechua language name, which means pool or circle of energy. Punco is next to the crystal called Facets on the lower mesa.

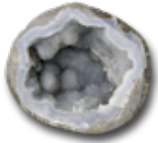


Facets – Found on the upper row of the lower mesa, this cuya is a square crystal. As with many crystals, Facets can be used to energetically charge a physical space, or body, after a disruption.



Earth – This dark, reddish brown stone, found in the lower right corner of the lower mesa, represents through its colors and patterns the geological ley lines of Pacha Mama.

Lightning – sourced from the High Andes, washed in the rivers along those incredibly steep slopes of that vertical world, down to the Island of Painted Stones. Lightning shares a unique mixture of both cleansing and charging properties. It is in the lower left of the upper mesa.



Circles – This geode has a central crystalline structure, which shifts light and reveals circles within circles, wonderful to contemplate during meditations, holding our gaze soft with eyes scanning the many swirls and sparkles. You can see Circles on the left corner of the upper mesa.

Sands – This is a smoothed stone, brought into the circle as a gift, holding the colors of sands and deserts. The type of stone and its origin are not known. Sands is next to Earth on the lower mesa, across from the faceted glass globe glowing at the lower center.



Veins – One of the larger stones in the Cuya Wisdom Circle, this one is raw amethyst, a purple quartz, with one polished face surrounded by rough edges. According to some healing lores, it is said that amethyst opens intuition and lucid dreaming, associated with the third eye and crown chakras, as well as promoting emotional stability, inner strength and peacefulness. You can see Veins on the tabletop near the sage in the upper left of the photo.

Shadows – This is a smaller Maui stone and its swirling white is looped within the black lava. You will find Shadows between Veins, the larger Amethyst, and Waters on the lower mesa.



Waters – This stone is a deep, dark blue and holds both the color and some of the potential shapes of all the Waters of Pacha Mama. You can see Waters between Shadows and Swirls on the upper row of the lower mesa.

Sweet Beauty – This smoothed black lava rock from Maui arrived on a beam of sunlight and the crest of an ocean wave from the Birth Canal, a unique energetic vortex in a sea cave or lava tube located on the black sand beach near Hana on east Maui. Sweet Beauty is on her own mesa in the upper right, grouped with others from this sacred stones collection along with a few good friends from MaryAnn's tribe.
